

Alumni Profile with George Harvey '35

Memories of Fly Fishing and Life in the Skull House

It is not hyperbole to refer to **George Harvey** as a legend in his own time. This Phi Kap from the class of 1935 is one of the world's foremost experts on fly fishing. Known as the Dean of Fly Fishing, he got his start at the Skull House.

When George joined Phi Kappa Sigma, the house was still young, a mere six years old at the time. In addition to serving the house as president, he ran both track and cross country.

"I was the captain of the cross-country team in the fall and captain of the track team in the spring," he said. "I was the only runner in the history of Penn State to win all my races in a season. That was my junior year. Then senior year, I was captain again, but I lost one race."

J. Orvis Keller Coming Home


